


InitiaLit

Kindergarten are using the InitiaLit program which integrates all of the Literacy strands.

- InitiaLit is a research initiative from Macquarie University
- This program addresses the five key components of effective reading instruction (phonics, phonemic awareness, fluency, vocabulary and comprehension skills) as well as handwriting, writing and spelling
- The program will feel slow as it aims to build the foundational knowledge before moving on to more advanced concepts.
- In Term 1, students will receive their own home reading log. Parents/carers are to record stories they have read to their child in the home reading log.


Home readers will be sent home, with decodable readers linking with the InitiaLit Program, beginning in Term 2





Talk for Writing

- Students will learn the text orally and use the story map to help with retelling.
- This allows students to build an understanding of sentence structure and sequence of events.
- In Term 3, they will begin writing their own stories.

Welcome to our school library, which is named 'Wingaru', meaning 'to think' in Dharug

General introduction

Library lessons take place on Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays. Library lessons are 30 minutes in duration for all students in K-6. Students will attend the library with the class teacher and the library teacher, Ms Grassi.

Classroom teachers will notify parents about their child's library day.

Borrowing

Students need to bring a library bag for borrowing books each week. Library bags can be purchased via the uniform shop.

If a book is lost, please inform the library teacher. Parents will be responsible for covering the replacement cost.

Scheduled parent-teacher interviews


- There are changes made to scheduled interviews in 2025:
 - All Kindergarten families will receive a phone call towards the end of Term 1 to have a quick chat about their child's transition. This will likely occur on a Tuesday or Thursday during school time or shortly after school.
 - K-6 families will have the opportunity to meet their class teachers at the beginning of Term 3, after Semester 1 reports have been sent out at the end of Term 2

The Meadowbank Way – Behaviour curriculum with explicit lessons

PAX Good Behaviour Game – Classroom behaviour games to help students learn to work together for mutual benefits



Yellow and Orange Cards

Orange cards – classroom incidents Yellow cards – playground incidents

- To document student behaviours, we use orange and yellow cards
- Depending on the severity of the behaviour, the consequences for:
 - Level 1 behaviours: student receives classroom teacher counselling during or after a learning session, parents may be contacted if a pattern is occurring
 - Level 2 behaviours: student receives Assistant Principal counselling in the Reflection Room during lunch play time, parents may be notified if a pattern is occurring
 - Level 3 behaviours: student receives detention with the Principal, parents will be notified





What can you do at home?

- Have a calm discussion about what happened:
 - Explain the boundary that was crossed
 - Identify the underlying problem
 - Brainstorm together some strategies/skills they need
 - Role-play scenarios and model the skill they need
- Arrange a meeting to speak with your child's teacher
- Please note: orange and yellow cards are not 'punishments'. Going to the reflection room is an opportunity for your child to be coached on how to make better choices next time




English as an Additional Language/Dialect (EAL/D) and New Arrivals Program (NAP)

EAL/D learners are identified through their enrolment information, during Kindergarten Best Start Days and initial testing. NAP support is for children who have newly arrived to Australia.

At our school EAL/D and NAP support is delivered through:

- team teaching during literacy to a small group or individual students within the classroom (withdrawal model). This has a focus on developing students' English skills
- making adjustments to class programs to develop speaking, listening, reading and writing skills.
- monitoring, assessing and reporting students progress through the 'EAL/D Learning Progression Phases'.





Speech Pathology – Miss Shannon

- Member of our school Learning and Support team
- Takes learning support referrals for assessment across K-6
- Available for private sessions on Tuesdays

In-class support for K-1 students:

- 1 lesson per class $\frac{1}{2}$ hour per week
- Aligned with curriculum
- To support students of all abilities in language, understanding instructions and expressing their ideas





High Potential and Gifted Education (HPGE)

We have changed the model to reach more children across the four domains of high potential and giftedness:

- Intellectual
- Social/emotional
- Physical
- Creative

We have many avenues for development in these areas:

- Intellectual (Maths explorer, public speaking and debating, Meadowbots and chess club)
- Social/ emotional (Sporting teams, SRC, Buddies)
- Physical (PSSA, Representative teams)
- Creative (Dance, Art, Choir, Orchestra and Recorders)
- HPGE students are identified by teachers and parent referrals.
