# English



Kindergarten will be exploring and developing a wide range of literacy skills this term through the InitiaLit program. We will also be reading a variety of quality literature to develop their vocabularies and explore different themes. Students will be learning to:

- hear and identify individual sounds
- retell and create oral stories
- write capital and lower case letters
- read and write simple words

#### Mathematics




This term we will be focusing on developing number sense with numbers to 10. This will include:

- develop consistent numeral formation
- quantify, organise and represent collections up to 10
- identify and represent part-whole combinations up to 10

We will also engage in daily mathematics activities investigating:

- combining and separating quantities
- simple data displays
- sorting, describing and representing two-dimensional shapes
- copying, creating, and completing repeating patterns
- three-dimensional objects

## Library



Students in Kindergarten will be introduced to library expectations and procedures for borrowing. Students will attend the library with their class teacher and the Teacher Librarian, Ms Grassi. Students are strongly encouraged to bring a library bag for borrowing books each week.

Students in Kindy (Early Stage One) may borrow up to 2 books.

The school library is open during lunch, allowing students to return and borrow books outside of their designated library lesson.

#### Premier's Reading Challenge

The Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) opens on Monday 24th February, 2025. Students in K-2 will be completing the Challenge during library lessons.

#### Creative Arts



This term students will participate in Visual Arts lessons where they will learn to appreciate and create artworks.

Students will:

- learn about important artists in history
- create a self-portrait
- compose artworks from a range of mediums

### History



In history, students will study a unit titled Aboriginal Peoples are connected to Country'. This topic provides students with the opportunity to learn about the ways that Aboriginal People connect with Country, Culture and Community. The unit identifies the importance of and difference between a Welcome to Country and Acknowledgement of Country with regard to respect. The unit goes on to identify ways local Aboriginal Peoples connect to Country by engaging with Aboriginal Dreaming Stories, artefacts and oral Histories, including oral traditions of passing along Cultural Knowledge and Dreaming Stories through art, symbolism, dance song and ceremony. The unit concludes by engaging with cultural objects to identify information about the past in the present.

# **Personal Development and Health:**

This term in PDH, students will be preparing for the Healthy Harold Bus visit by learning about the importance of creating safe and healthy habits. This will include choosing healthy foods for a balanced diet, the importance of personal hygiene and the benefits of physical activity and sleep.

#### Physical Education and Sport:

This term in PE lessons, students will be participating in a variety of fun activities designed to be fun and keep them moving! They will be learning fundamental movement skills such as static balance, sprint running, and vertical jumping. Later in the term students will develop their handeye coordination with a focus on throwing and catching.

# Science and Technology



In Science this term, students will learn about how push and pull forces create movement and how they are essential in the world. They will be introduced to basic principles of scientific investigation. Students will also be designing and making their own moving toy.

### Homework



Homework for first term is for parents! Please read to your child every night. It is important to read with your child for at least 10-15 minutes every day. Part of the reading process is talking about what you have read so that children develop their vocabularies and deepen their understandings of the world around them. You are more than welcome to read to them in a language other than English. Please record these texts in the Home Reading Diary. **These will be handed out in the children's home reading folders in Week 5. Each class' home reading folder and diary are due on Mondays. New homework will then be sent home every Tuesday afternoon.** 

News: each week students will be given a different topic to prepare a talk on for their news. The topics and your child's news day were sent out in your child's home reading folder in Week 5.

#### Other reminders



- Morning drop-off is between 8.15-8.45am. Students must arrive by 8:45am. Afternoon pick-up is at 2:45. For drop-off in the morning and pick-up in the afternoon, students need to be seated in their class lines under the hall COLA. If you are running late in the afternoon or unable to pick up your child, please make alternative arrangements as the teachers do not provide supervision after this time.
- Kiss and Ride is for **drop-off only** (not pick-up in the afternoon).
- You can book your child in for before and after school care with our providers, TheirCare.

- Students must be wearing the correct **summer uniform**. Jewelry and other accessories should not be worn.
- Students need to bring their **school hat to school everyday.** Students will not be allowed to play in the sun if they do not bring hats.
- Lost property is located near the Canteen if students have misplaced any items.
- Please pack a small piece of fruit or vegetables for Crunch n Sip everyday. This should be packed separately to your child's lunchbox and be in a small container. Please ensure fruit/vegetables are cut up and easy for your child to eat.
- Please pack a variety of healthy food and snacks for recess and lunch.
- Student lunchboxes should have a handle or strap so that they can carry them up and down the many flights of stairs to our playground.
- Students must bring a water bottle.
- Ensure **all items are CLEARLY labelled** with your child's name especially after a few washes!
- You may wish to bring in a paint smock to avoid paint getting on your child's clothing during visual art lessons.
- A spare pair of undies and shorts (to be kept in their bags for emergencies) is recommended.
- As part of our whole school approach to a healthy lifestyle, and due to a growing number of students with allergies/anaphylaxis, we ask parents not to bring in food for student birthdays. If you would like to celebrate your child's birthday at school, you can donate a book to the class library that we can use throughout the year and read together on your child's birthday. This is not compulsory.
- If your child is absent from school, you will need to inform the school. Please let us know via one of the following methods: the Sentral parent portal, emailing the school or calling the office
- Notes for the office need to be returned in the black post box near the library/office (below the Level 1 staircase on ground level)
